RESOLUTION NO. 19047

RELATING TO CITY BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS; ESTABLISHING THE PIMA COUNTY-CITY OF TUCSON COMMISSION ON ADDICTION, PREVENTION, AND TREATMENT, DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TUCSON, ARIZONA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. There is hereby established a Pima County – City of Tucson Commission on Addiction, Prevention, and Treatment which shall be composed of nineteen (19) members and seven (7) ex-officio members, all of whom shall be residents of Pima County and shall be knowledgeable about addiction, prevention, and treatment issues and concerns. Members shall be jointly appointed by the Pima County Board of Supervisors ("Board") and the Tucson Mayor and Council ("Council"), shall serve at the will of both bodies without compensation, and are subject to reappointment by the Board and Council. Membership shall include representatives of private business, law-related professions, healthcare, prevention and treatment organizations and providers and recovering addicts or family members of recovering addicts.

SECTION 2. The purpose of the Commission is to provide advice and make recommendations to the Board and the Council with respect to the social, financial and health consequences of addiction in Pima County.

SECTION 3. Initial membership of the Commission shall be as follows:

SECTION 4. The Commission shall meet at least quarterly, elect its own officers, and comply with all applicable laws and regulations, including Open

Meeting and Public Records laws. The Commission may adopt rules and regulations in relation to its functioning consistent with this Resolution and other laws relating to the Commission's functions. If the Commission adopts rules and regulations, two (2) copies must be filed in the City Clerk's Office in accordance with Tucson City Code Sec. 10A-136, and two (2) copies must be filed in the Office of the Pima County Clerk to the Board.

SECTION 5. Financial and administrative support for the Commission will not be provided by or solicited from Pima County or the City of Tucson. Neither the Commission nor any member of the Commission may obligate in any manner or form, or incur any charge or expense on behalf of, Pima County or the City of Tucson without prior authorization by the Board or Council, respectively.

SECTION 6. The Commission shall render to the Board or Council such reports and recommendations as are requested by the Board or Council.

SECTION 7. Pima County and City of Tucson staff shall evaluate the Commission's usefulness and effectiveness with respect to County and City operations and functions at the end of the grand-funded period, September 30, 2003.


SECTION 8. The Commission shall cease all operations and shall no longer exist pursuant to this Resolution if any of the following occur: (1) the Commission lacks sufficient funding from sources other than Pima County or the City of Tucson; (2) the evaluation of the Commission by Pima County and the City of Tucson staff fails to substantiate that the needs and interests of Pima County and the City of Tucson continue to be effectively served by the Commission, and the County

Administrator files the evaluation in the Office of the Pima County Clerk to the Board; or (3) the Board or the Council repeals this Resolution.


SECTION 9. The various City and Pima County officers and employees are authorized and directed to perform all acts necessary or desirable to give effect to this ordinance.

SECTION 10. WHEREAS, it is necessary for the preservation of the peace, health, and safety of the City of Tucson and Pima County that this ordinance become immediately effective, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its passage and adoption.


